


ALAN ABRAHAM

Congregation Keneseth Israel


"I volunteer at JFS because I enjoy working with people and it is very rewarding. The staff and volunteers are warm and friendly and we have the same goals: to assist people however we can."


LIZ FEARCongregation Am Haskalah




VICKIE SEMMEL






