COMMUNITY FOOD PANTRY



The Community Food Pantry serves households struggling with food insecurity, using a choice model that provides both food and personal care items. The Food Pantry is open to individuals and families living in the 18104 zip code as well as Jewish community members in the Lehigh Valley.

OLDER ADULT SERVICES



Jewish Family Service offers case management services to clients over the age of 65 living in Lehigh and Northampton Counties. A licensed social worker collaborates with clients, families, and caregivers to develop care plans that connect them to resources, programs, and services which will enhance their quality of life.

ACCESSIBILITY & INCLUSION



Jewish Family Service works with individuals and families whose lives are impacted by issues related to intellectual, developmental, and physical disabilities. Our doctorate-level coordinator specializes in assessing the needs of the individual and developing strength-based treatment plans to foster greater self-reliance and independence. In addition, JFS offers psychoeducational support groups for individuals with disabilities and their family members.

COUNSELING



Licensed clinical social workers at Jewish Family Service provide a full range of counseling services to individuals, couples, families, and groups of all religions and backgrounds Through a strength based model, clients develop strategies to cope with change, loss, or the stresses of everyday life. Medicare and insurance are accepted and a sliding fee schedule is available for uninsured clients.
